
Program Objectives

Stepping Stones' History



- Oct 2006: 3 volunteers teaching English in 1 school
- 2008: Training started; First I Care project
- 2009: First Summer Program; First paid employee & office
- 2010: Started to develop curriculum
- 2011: Registration in Hong Kong
- 2012: Funding from Shanghai Soong Ching Ling

Foundation

2013: Officially registered non-profit in Shanghai Minhang

District

- 2015: Teacher Training Program started
- 2016: Digital Literacy & Videolink programs launched
- 2018: Founder received British Empire Medal
- 2020: Launched Home Classroom program
- 2023: Launched Social Emotional Learning program
- 2023: Achieved 3A status for a non-profit in China

Why do the children need us?

- Though schools have improved, many students are still under-served
- Students benefit from the exposure to different communities and ideas – volunteers benefit too!

Why teach English?

- English is one of three core subjects in the curriculum, and the biggest differentiator between rural/migrant and urban children
- Qualified teachers are in short supply and the quality of teaching is low



Why teach digital literacy & life skills?

- Children lack confidence (especially about their future)
- Low rate of digital literacy

Why teach social emotional learning?

- Children's unattended emotional issues have become commonplace among children, especially after Covid pandemic
- Intervention rate is low in schools

Why focus on eye care?

- Eye problems go untreated due to lack of resources and misunderstanding of issues
- Vision problems can seriously impact education
